Our work is pulled together by our strong commitment to remove barriers for students, whether that's around developing a campaign on housing rights, to consulting the Council on sexual health commissioning.

What's the job?

The Wellbeing & Peer Support Lead is responsible for the operational development of the wellbeing service & provision at HSU as well as supporting the strategic development work.

This includes managing key interventions, supporting student co-production of wellbeing assets and advocating for student wellbeing needs within HSU, SHU & the City region, including collaborating on key policy issues.

The role exists to ensure students are well-supported in their university journey through impactful and student-informed wellbeing initiatives, making Sheffield Hallam a supportive environment for all students.

You are a confident individual with a background in wellbeing work, whether that's policy, peer-support, wellbeing services or something different entirely and are looking for the next step in your career.
