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Ladybower Reservoir is a large 'Y' shaped reservoir, the lowest of the three in the Upper Derwent Valley. It was built between 1935 - 1943 and then it took a further two years to fill it.

The villages of Derwent and Ashopton had to be flooded to create this reservoir and the inhabitants were relocated to Yorkshire Bridge estate, just downstream of Ladybower Dam. It was opened in 24 September 1945 by King George VI.

This is an 8.5 mile waking route, adequate time should be allowed to ensure the route can be completed safely.

Please ensure you pre-plan your journey and walking route prior to departing and make sure to tell someone where you're going.
