



Representation and Democracy at HSU

What is Representation?

Representation is the system in which students use their voice to make changes to their educational experience.

What is a Course Rep?

Course Reps gather thoughts and opinions from other students on their course and discuss their findings with staff to agree on how the course could be improved.

Time commitment: 2 – 4 hours a month



Why become a Course Rep?


- Gain formal recognition for your contribution, including through the new Course Rep Accreditation Scheme (now linked to the Hallam Award)


I don't want to be a course rep but...

How can you make the most out of the Representation offer as a committee?


- Know who the course reps are on your course

- Know how to sign up to be a course rep





How do I escalate issues?

Once you've used Find My Rep and know the names of your course and department reps, what's next?

- 1. Contact them using the emails provided
- 2. Give as much information as you can
- 3. Ask for updates and feed back to your society

What would you do...

You're at a social and a member says...

They're finding a topic particularly hard and are worried about the end of year exam.

How can you use the Rep system to support them?

- Put on Study Social
- Open the Social to wider student pool
- Contact course reps with the date/time and get them to pass on the details
- Gain membership from students wanting support and community



What would you do...

You're at a social and your members are having a conversation...

Their lecturer isn't responding to their emails about an upcoming assignment. They said they've waited 72 hours as per their automatic response, and politely followed up, but not response has been given.

How can you use the Rep system to support them?

- Signpost to course rep and wellbeing support
- Contact Department Rep to escalate the issue





What can I get out of SU Democracy?

Democracy at Hallam is all about improving the experience of students.

- Working Committees
 - These are student meetings supported by the SU that meet to discuss topics on liberation, wellbeing, sustainability and more to make change
- Council
 - Discusses and passes new ideas and policies
- Elected Reps and Officers
 - Ensures all voices are heard bringing forward new ideas
